### Things to do

#### An Amazon Adventure

With such a diverse landscape and so many iconic sights, it's no wonder many travellers leave Brazil wanting more. The paradisiacal Amazon rainforest, often called the green lung of the earth, is a must-see for any nature lover. Take a boat ride along the Amazon River on your way to your jungle lodge, then delve into the forest to visit a local tribe or fish for piranha.

#### Christ the Redeemer

The world-famous Christ the Redeemer statue, known in Portuguese as *Cristo Redentor*, stands above Rio de Janeiro with arms outstretched at the top of the mountain of Corcovado. At nearly 100 feet tall, it's an unmissable sight for any stop in Rio. Take the funicular train to the top of Corcovado to get up close, then snap panoramic photos of the sprawling city below.

#### Iguazú Falls

Iguazú Falls lies at the convergence of Brazil, Argentina and Paraguay, creating one of the most breathtaking natural wonders in this corner of the world. With over 270 separate cataracts plunging 80 metres into the river below, it is the most voluminous waterfall on the planet. For an unmatched experience, take a boat trip to the base and view it from both the Brazil and Argentina sides.

## **Best time to visit**

You can book your holiday to Brazil year-round. The warmest months are November to March, with the rainy season usually lasting from December to February. From May to September, temperatures can dip to about 15°C in the colder areas but still climb to the mid 20s°C in places like Rio.

## **What's the weather like in Brazil from November to March?**

During the warmer months, temperatures usually vary between 30°C to 40°C. The most humid month is October, when humidity levels can reach 80% in Rio de Janeiro. Even if you visit during the rainy season (December to February), you'll typically encounter short bursts of rain rather than all-day pouring, with plenty of sunshine in between.
